Explanation of Scorecard

S = A vote in <u>support</u> of our position

Green Bill Title = A bill we supported

Bill titles reflect a layman's description of the legislation, not their official titles

Age Verification

HB1257 – An act to require that p*rnographic websites implement an age verification system to keep minor children off their sites

Note: Due to political game-playing, there is no clear Senate vote on HB1257. As a result, we have used the "smoke-out" vote (which required the bill to be delivered to the floor) and the final floor vote on the conference committee report (final action to kill the bill). Each vote was weighted as .5 of their score. For example: a senator who stood for the smoke-out (a good vote) but voted no on the final conference committee report (a bad vote) was counted as .5 support and .5 oppose.

Partners in Education

SB72 – An act to increase the cap of the *Partners in Education Scholarship Fund* (provides scholarships to low income students attending private schools) from \$3.5 million to \$5 million

Petition Signature Removal

HB1244 – An act to allow for a person to remove their name from a petition if they were deceived or coerced into signing it, or if they no longer support the petition

Obscene Performances

HB1178 - An act to clarify that no obscene performances may happen on college campuses

Marriage Age

HB1154 – An act to raise the marriage age and prohibit 16 and 17 yr. olds from getting married, even with parental consent

Non-Consensual Pregnancy

HB1204 – An act regarding the removal of a condom during intercourse, which would have added the term "non-consensual pregnancy" into state law

Additional Legal Classifications

HB1155 - An act to add new classifications (like "homophobia," "transphobia," etc.) into the discrimination statutes

Healthcare Sharing Ministries

HB1207 – An act to place additional reporting regulations on Healthcare Sharing Ministries and place them under the Division of Insurance

School Choice

HB1250 – An act to establish a school choice program, where state funding would follow the child to whichever school the family deems best for the child

*Note: Rep. Sauder was excused from the floor vote, but voted against the bill in the prior committee hearing

Abortion Laws Video

HB1224 – An act to require the Department of Health to produce educational materials to further explain that doctors can take any action necessary, including an abortion, if they determine it is needed to save the mother's life

Abortion in all 9 months

SB210 - An act to repeal all of the current abortion laws and allow for abortion in all 9 months

Chemical Castration

SB216 – An act to allow for the chemical castration of minor children if the parent signs the consent form, undoing some of the key protections implemented in the "Help Not Harm" Bill that is now law.
